ALLOCATIONS FROM WCD III TO WIAA STATE MEETS ON FEBRUARY 20-22, 2024

- 4A: 3 teams, 4 AA, and 13 individuals
- 2A/3A: 2 teams, 4 AA, and 11 individuals
- Only schools qualified to the WCD III meet <u>as a team</u> are eligible to qualify for the State meet <u>as a team</u>.

ROTATION / COMPETITORS

See attached for a detailed rotation schedule. Please note that the times are approximate. An awards ceremony will be held after the last rotation. A team consists of six (6) competitors per event, including any all-around competitors, with five (5) scores counting toward the team.

ROSTERS / LINE-UPS

· Competition line-ups can be submitted at the coaches' meeting prior to the meet.

Note: your roster can only include up to 16 competitors, and it **must be the same roster you submitted for the sub-district qualifying meet.** For those who qualified as a team, it must include the same alternates. The competition line-ups (order) can be submitted at the coaches' meeting prior to the meet, or as soon as possible, using the attached announcement form.

• If you qualify as a team, send your original complete roster.

- If you only have individual qualifiers, delete all other names from your original rosters. Then send an updated roster with only qualifiers names on it.
- Note for athletes who qualify for state, WIAA rules state:
 - 25.2.5 By entering participants in postseason competition, each member school certifies that, barring injury, illness, religious observance or unforeseen events, the team or individuals representing the school will participate in every level of competition through the completion of the state championship event.
 - NOTE: An unforeseen event can include, but not be limited to, an individual that qualifies for two spring state championship events. In order to meet this rule, the athletic director for that individual's school must contact the WIAA staff who oversees at least one of the affected sports to withdraw the individual from one of the state championships by midnight on the Saturday prior to the beginning of the spring state championships.
 - 25.2.6 Any withdrawal or intentional forfeiture for a reason other than those listed in Rule 25.2.5 shall be considered a violation of WIAA rules and regulations, and shall be subject to penalties as determined by the WIAA Executive Board

PASS LIST

- Please email pass list to John Yellam (<u>jyellam@fwps.org</u>) no later than Wednesday Feb 12th. If a school does not submit a pass list, anyone trying to enter as support for the team/supervision will have to pay entry
- Pass lists can be submitted along/with the roster

MUSIC

NOTE: Ascend has a separate speaker that can teams either Bluetooth or use an aux cord to play music for floor routines. It is recommended to test music during rotations to support flow of the meet

PARKING

Limited parking. You are <u>advised to carpool</u> and follow the parking attendant's directions. Please send messaging out to your communities to support the limited parking. Buses can park nearby at Capital High School or Olympia High School for the duration of the meet. Both are approximately 3 miles away.

ATHLETIC TRAINER

Athletic training services will be on site and provided by Olympic Sport and Spine. It is encouraged to bring your own supplies since this is an off-site event, trainers will have limited supplies for the day.

WARM-UPS

NOTE: The only time the competition equipment will be available for warm-up is during the timed warm-up period, prior to competition. This will be explained further in the coaches' meeting.

- Only competing gymnasts in uniform, **entering with team prior to their meet**, will be admitted free entrance. Gymnasts will be expected to pay if not participating in the meet.
- No participant passes will be issued inform gymnasts they are to enter in one group with a coach supervising. As per WIAA guidelines, a maximum of twenty (20) team personnel will be admitted - to include a maximum of sixteen (16) gymnasts and four (4) other designated team personnel (coaches, managers, statisticians, medical, etc.). Gymnasts and team personnel will be hand-stamped to allow re-entry throughout the meet.
- Press passes will be accepted with proper identification.
- League passes will NOT be accepted.
- Washington State Coaches Association and WSSAAA passes will be accepted.
- Cheerleaders and song leaders of participating schools will be admitted free, only if in uniform.

SPECTATORS

- Spectators are not allowed in the competition area
- No outside food or drink
- Doors open at 8:00am (No Early Admittance)

The WCD will provide two team trophies and individual awards for 1st-8th places and state qualifiers.
