TICKET GATE: Will open at 1 hour before 1st scheduled game time.

DIRECTIONS and PARKING

Team Drop off and Pick up, Bus and Parking information.

Arriving at Foss HS for spectators: When arriving to Foss please make sure to come to the "front of the school" entrance which is coming from 19th street and turning onto Clay Huntington Way (as if you are going to Cheney Stadium). Remain on Clay Huntington Way until you come to the second large parking lot. Once you've parked please proceed up the stairs to the cafeteria doors where payment will be taken. (Please do not park in the "back" of the school which would be off of Tyler street)

Bus Drop off/pick up and Parking for teams – Buses will proceed on Clay Huntington Way and circle all the way around to the very front of the school where the bus loading zone is. Please drop off/pick up teams here. Once the bus has dropped of the team, they can then go park in either one of the huge parking lots to their left.

PASSES and GROUP ACCESS

SUPERVISOR PASS

Accepted Passes: WCD Executive Board, SWD Executive Board, WOA member or observer card, WSSAAA, WSCA Coaches Association.

*No other league or seasonal passes will be accepted.

GYM RE-ENTRY

No PASS-OUT (re-entry) once admitted. This includes halftime. We will allow re-entry for emergencies at the discretion of gym staff.

GROUPS

Band Director and band members IN UNIFORM will be admitted free. <u>Home and Visiting School bands</u> – game manager must be notified by noon of the day you play, if you plan to have your band attend.

Cheerleaders IN UNIFORM will be admitted free. There will be no halftime show. Therefore, Dance/Drill team members must purchase a ticket.

PRESS / TV / RADIO PASSES

May be obtained by contacting Game Manager, Shiante Reed, and displaying an appropriate media pass. Radio and TV broadcasts must submit an application and obtain approval through the West Central District Director.

FACILITY INFO and SPECTATOR SEATING

Only athletes, coaches, team personnel & officials are allowed on the court.

NO OUTSIDE FOOD OR DRINKS ALLOWED. Concessions will be provided through our concession stand located next to the gymnasium. Concessions will be CASH ONLY!!

Halftime is 10 minutes. There will be **NO HALF TIME** shows by Band, Drill, or Cheer.

NO signs other than the OFFICIAL SCHOOL BANNER will be allowed.

Restrooms are located next to the concession stand. Locker rooms are for team use only. There are restrooms connected to the team rooms and are only to be used by team members.

SEATING

Fans and student section will be across from their respective school benches. WARNING: Viewing the game from the Student Section may be obstructed due to prolonged standing.

There is no standing on plastic seats of bleachers. No 1st row (floor seating) allowed.

BAND SEATING

The home team band shall share the home school student section The visiting team band shall share the visiting school student section

TEAM INFORMATION

TEAM ROSTERS

LIMIT: 12 players (in uniform) and 9 Support personal (coaches, managers, statistician & licensed medical) for a total of 21.

The number of people on the sidelines is limited to: team members in uniform, coaches, and managers, ball boy/girl, team physician or trainer. The only coaches permitted to be on the sidelines during a state or district playoff contest shall be limited to the coaches who have been named as basketball coaches by the school district for the regular season. All other persons without sideline authorization from game manager will be escorted into stands.

LOCKER ROOMS

Locker rooms are located in the main gym on opposite sides of home and away team benches. Locker rooms will have names on them, only team members are allowed in the locker rooms.

GAME JERSEYS

HOME SCHOOL: will wear WHITE JERSEYS VISITOR: will wear DARK COLORED JERSEYS

PRE-GAME WARMUP and SCHEDULE

Teams will be allowed on the court for Pre-game warm up starting at 20 minutes before scheduled start time. Pre-game warm up will be a minimum of 15 minutes.

Teams will report to their bench when horn is honked with 1 minute left in warm ups.

Team introductions, as follows:

National Anthem (if 1st game of the day)

+ Visiting team will be announced first, proceeding down the roster in a numerical order.

+ Home team will be announced second, proceeding down the roster in a numerical order.

OFFICIALS

Three (3) WOA certified basketball officials will be assigned to the game. Officials are selected by their association to work at this tournament.

GAMES COMMITTEE

The Games Committee will include the following: Tournament/Event Manager – Shiante Reed A coach, athletic director, or school administrator present at the game – TBD Another event staff worker – TBD Official - TBD The Games Committee, composed of at least three and no more than 5 of the individuals listed above, will hear and decide on any protest and/or appeal.

SPECTATOR EXPECTATIONS

STUDENT CONDUCT

As games are school functions, ALL SPECTATORS are expected to exercise good judgement in their conduct and dress. <u>UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT IS CAUSE FOR EJECTION FROM THE PREMISES</u>. Artificial noisemakers, such as air horns, bells, whistles, etc. are prohibited, as is the throwing of confetti, and/or other objects. Megaphones are to be used by the cheer staff only.

It is important that building **administrators** provide game supervision **in the stands** and promote a safe enjoyable event for everyone. Please remind students to wear shirts, to observe the **TPS policy** of no body or face paint, no masks, and to observe good sportsmanship. If an issue with one of your students arises, we will ask you to address it.

FAN AND SPECTATORS

The supervision of this section will be the responsibility of the school. Spectators are not allowed on the court at any time and are required to stay behind the ropes held in place in front of stands at the end of the game.

DUTIES OF SCHOOL SUPERVISORS

Report to the event manager at least 30 minutes prior to their team's game

Must wear supervisor/school identification so that it is visible and easily seen.

Sit with your school's student body and fans while your team is competing.

Be active and visible in the cheering section with your student body and fans during all contests to discourage problems.

Be willing to approach students and/or community representatives who display inappropriate behavior.

Notify tournament staff of potential problem individuals.

Be of assistance as requested by facility security staff or tournament management staff.

Be sure aisles and stairways are kept clear in the stands.

Keep your students and fans from entering onto the court and foster the traits of good sportsmanship.

Assist in the orderly flow of traffic of fans entering and exiting the facility.

At the conclusion of your game, assist your school's students and fans in leaving the bleachers.
